Rohrbach	1817-1859	Lutheran		Served Rohrbach, Worms, Johannestal and Waterloo. Lutheran parish was converted into a Reformed parish in 1859 and named Rohrbach-Worms. Lutherans in the original Rohrbach parish were expected to move to Glückstal. Instead, however, Johannestal-Waterloo Lutheran parish was established in 1860 and the Lutheran parish Worms-Rohrbach was established in 1861. The original Rohrbach parish was divided into three parishes: Rohrbach-Worms (Reformed), Worms-Rohrbach (Lutheran), Johannestal-Waterloo (Lutheran)	Busch - Lutheran Church & Schools 1867

Worms-Rohrbach	1860	Lutheran		Formed after Rohrbach parish was converted from Lutheran to Reformed. Schnurr lists the Lutheran parish as Rohrbach-Worms.
