Summary Tables of the Wagner Family

(My lineal ancestors below are underlined)

Earliest Records for our Wagner Family in Kronach, Bavaria

Matheus Wagner

The earliest known ancestor for the Wagner family. His first marriage was to a woman named **Margaret**. One child is listed in the Kronach church records:

1. Regina Dorothea Wagner, bapt. Sept. 22, 1710.

Matheus' second marriage was on Nov. 3, 1722 to <u>Anna Catherine</u> <u>Schmidt</u>. The marriage record refers to Matheus as a "citizen" of Kronach and a "widower," and to Anna Catherine as a "virgin." Three children from this second marriage (4 total for Matheus):

2. Johann Christopher Wagner, bapt. April 23, 1723. His godfather was Johann Christopher Mayer. He married <u>Maria Puttenhorn</u> on Feb. 4, 1753. He was listed in Latin as an *Auriga*, which means a coachman or wagon driver, and a resident of Kronach. The only child listed from that marriage was:

a. Franz Wagner, born and bapt. Dec. 20, 1754.

- 3. Johann Andreas Wagner, bapt. Nov. 29, 1726.
- 4. Johann Martin Wagner, bapt. Jan. 24, 1730.

Karmann/Carmann family (Franz Wagner's first wife)

Franz Wagner b. Dec. 20, 1754 from Kronach was married on April 22, 1792 in Rohrbach, Rhine Pfalz, to <u>Margaret Carmann/Karmann</u> from Mannheim, the daughter of <u>Johann Carmann</u>, a painter, and <u>Maria Ursula Dorrhaut</u>. The marriage record confirms the names of Franz's parents in Kronach. Franz had one child with Margaret: <u>Ferdinand Wagner</u> born July 15, 1793, Germersheim, Pfalz. Margaretha died shortly after childbirth.

Würth and Stauch family in Insheim, Pfalz (relatives of Eva Würth, second wife of Franz Wagner)

Franz's second marriage was on Feb. 4, 1796 to **Eva Würth**. She was born Oct. 25, 1755, Insheim, Pfalz. Franz had one child with Eva: **Franz Wagner (jr.)**, born May 19, 1798, Insheim, Pfalz. Eva's family history is below:

Johann Peter Würth

Resided in Rohrbach, below Landau. Wife: **Margaret Schwartz**. Children: **Anton Würth**, b. 1725, marr. Oct. 9, 1752 to: **Anna Margaret Stauch** in Insheim. The baptismal records for his children in 1761 and 1771 refer to Anton as a "swine herder" (*Subulcus*). Some of his children were illiterate. He died Aug. 27, 1771 at the stated age of 46. Children (all 8 born in Insheim): **1. Margaret Würth**, b: Dec. 17, 1752; d: Aug. 24, 1778, age 26.

2. Maria Magdalena Würth, b: Aug. 1, 1754, m: Jan. 30, 1786 Leonard Rieger.

3. Eva Katharina Würth, bapt. Oct. 25, 1755, m: Feb. 4, 1796 Franz Wagner.

4. Johann Valentin Würth, b: Oct. 6, 1757, m: Jan. 14, 1782 Elisabeth Weber; she d. Mar. 24, 1810. His second marr: May 7, 1811 to Eva Barbara Mercker. The priest notes in the first marriage record that "they were ignorant of true writing," so they signed with an X. They also both signed the baptisms for their children with an X. Children from first marriage:

a. Anna Maria Würth, born: Jan. 31, 1783, d: Feb. 24, 1783 age 4 weeks.

b. Son, died at birth Dec. 2, 1783.

c. Christian Würth, born: Feb. 3, 1785; m: Sept. 20, 1810 Victoria Flieher. Children:

d. Anne Maria Wirth, born July 24, 1812. Note the surname spelling changes to "Wirth" at this time.

e. Johann Jacob Wirth, born Sept. 14, 1814.

f. Barbara Wirth, born Oct. 31, 1816.

g. Joseph Wirth, born Sept. 26, 1818.

h. Anna Maria Würth, born: Nov. 17, 1789.

i. Johann Georg Würth, b: Aug. 6, 1793.

Children from second marriage (J. Valentin and Barbara Mercker):

j. Apolonia ("Ablonia") Wirth, born Oct. 22, 1813.

5. Anna Maria Würth, b: April 9, 1761; m: Georg Adam Mercker; she d: Aug. 27, 1816.

6. Peter Würth, born 1762, a brick-mason in Insheim, wife: Anna Maria Knoll. He d: Sept. 5, 1814, stated age 52. Children:

a. Maria Barbara Würth, born: Dec. 13, 1800.

b. Georg Michael Würth, born: Feb. 11, 1798.

c. Georg Michael Würth, b: Mar. 31, 1799.

d. Magdalena Würth, born May 28, 1809, d: July 1, 1810.

7. Joseph Würth, born: Oct. 12, 1765, a brick mason in Insheim, m: July 4, 1790 Anna Maria Kirschthaler. They did not sign the baptismal records for their children. Children:

a. Appollonia Würth, born: June 10, 1791. She probably died in infancy because the next child had the same name and same godmother.

b. Appollonia Würth, born: July 27, 1792

c. Eva Catharina Würth, b: May 8, 1794, died the same day. Her godmother was Eva Catharina Wagner.

d. Peter Würth, born: Aug. 21, 1795, d: June 4, 1814, stated age 19.

e. Johann Jacob Würth, born: Sept. 13, 1797, m: Nov. 28, 1816 Maria Catherina Buckel. Children:

1) Johann Georg Wirth, born Nov. 10, 1818.

2) Margaret Wirth, born Nov. 10, 1820.

f. Joseph Leopold Würth, born: Feb. 19, 1800.

g. Maria Magdalena Würth, born Mar. 19, 1808.

h. Joseph Würth, born Nov. 20, 1813.

8. Andreas Würth, born: July 11, 1771 (2 months before the death of his father, Anton), m. Feb. 18, 1798 Maria Martin. Children:

a. Maria Josepha Würth, born Nov. 19, 1799.

b. Johann Joseph Würth, born Feb. 26, 1802.

c. Johann Joseph Würth, born April 26, 1806.

Friedrich Stauch

A cooper in Insheim, died sometime before 1780. Wife: **Anna Margaret Rösch**, b: 1697, she died Feb. 26, 1780, at stated age of 83, the widow of Friederich Stauch. Children:

1. Maria Elizabeth Stauch, b: Sept. 1, 1731.

2. Katherina Stauch, b: Aug. 5, 1736.

3. Anna Margaret Stauch, marr: Oct. 9, 1752 **Anton Würth** from Rohrbach. Children:

a. Eva Catharina Würth, bapt. Oct. 25, 1755, m: Feb. 4, 1796 **Franz** Wagner.

Franz Wagner's oldest son Ferdinand and his descendants

<u>Franz Wagner</u>

Born Dec. 20, 1754 in Kronach, Bavaria. First marriage on April 22, 1792 to <u>Margaret Karmann</u>, they had one child: <u>Ferdinand</u> born July 15, 1793, Germersheim, Pfalz. Franz's second marriage was on Feb. 4, 1796 to **Eva Würth**. He had one child with Eva: **Franz Wagner (jr.)**, born May 19, 1798, Insheim, Pfalz. Franz, Eva, and his two sons emigrated to the colony of Rastadt in 1809, where he died in 1811. After the death of Franz, Eva remarried to Johann Schirner and moved to the nearby colony of München in 1812. Ferdinand and Franz jr. both married and raised their families there.

Ferdinand Wagner

Born July 15, 1793 Germersheim, Pfalz, son of Franz Wagner and Margaret Karmann. The death records show that Ferdinand died on May 19, 1855 in

München, age 60. This yields a birth year of 1795 which approximates the other existing records. He was stated to have a wife and 6 children.

The available records suggest that Ferdinand may have been married three times. On August 17, 1815 he married **Elisabeth Kniel** in the colony of München; she was born ca. 1793, the daughter of **Anselm Kniel** and **Elisabeth** from Tiefenbach, Baden. Anselm Kniel's wife, Elisabeth, died on Sept. 26, 1820, buried in the cemetery at Rastadt, she was age 50, and the Latin phrasing may state that she left behind a widower and a son. There is limited evidence showing that Ferdinand may have been married a second time to **Elisabeth Kroll** by 1827, her surname is unclear. They had a son **Johann Georg** in 1827. From 1831 and afterward there are three records that show he was married (a third time?) to **Elisabeth Miller/Müller**, daughter of **Johann Miller** (most likely **Johann Miller** in Speier). The 1828 report for München shows that Ferdinand had 5 sons and 1 daughter, and probably more later. His known children were:

1. Johann Ignatz Wagner, bapt. Aug. 1, 1816, parents stated to be Ferdinand Wagner and **Elisabeth Kniel**. They resided in Rastadt and moved to München in 1817.

 Johann Jacob Wagner, bapt. Aug. 29, 1821, parents stated to be Ferdinand Wagner and Elis. Kniel, they resided in München at that date.
 Michael Wagner, bapt. May 9, 1823, son of Ferdinand Wagner and Elisabeth Kniel, München.

4. Johann Georg Wagner, bapt. May 26, 1827 in München, parents stated to be Ferdinand Wagner and Elis. (surname unclear, either Kroll or Kniel). He married Nov. 10, 1850 with Margaretha Bast (also referred to as Katherina Bast) born ca. 1828 in Speyer, da. of Johann Joseph Bast (b. ca. 1805) & Anna Maria Philipps (b. ca. 1812). Georg's marriage record (in Cyrillic) states that his parents were Ferdinand Wagner and Elisabeth Kroll. Georg Wagner served as godfather for Georg Kühlwein, April 12, 1867, in the colony of Romanka. Georg died 27 April 1869 München, age 40, wife stated to be Margaretha, death record shows children Maria Anna, Philip, Kathareina, and Barbara. The baptismal records show all these children:

a. Anna Maria Wagner, born Aug. 29, 1851 München, godparents Adam Wagner and Anna Maria Kreidel. She d. Oct. 12, 1852, age 1.
b. Maria Anna Wagner, born Sept. 26, 1853 in München, godparents Joseph Gotting and Maria Anna Bast. She marr. Joseph Hoppner (probably Hübner), son of Georg Hoppner/Hübner. They had a daughter Katherina who died in München Dec. 17, 1878, age 2 years.

c. Franz Wagner, born April 3, 1856 in München, godparents Franz Wagner and Agnes Heil.

d. Margaret Wagner, born July 3, 1858, München, godparents Michael Wagner and Margaret Wagner. Another record (below) shows Margaret Wagner born Aug. 8, 1867 München.

e. Katharina Wagner born Feb. 26, 1861 in München, godparents Adam Vogt and Katharina Frey, she married Jan. 29, 1880 in Rastadt to Philipp Eberle (son of Karl Eberle & Katharina Heck).¹
f. Barbara Wagner, born Nov. 4, 1864, München, godparents Martin Bullinger and Barbara Thomä.

g. Margaret Wagner, born August 8, 1867, München, godparents Michael Kessel and Maria Anna Wollbaum. Did the Margaret born in 1858 die in childhood?

h. Maria Josepha Wagner, born Sept. 2, 1869, Kuschnerowo, mother shown as Katharina Bast, godparents Johann Frey and Maria Anna Flick.

5. Johann Adam Wagner, was married on Nov. 18, 1852, age 21 (= born 1831), stated to be the son of Ferdinand and Elisabeth Miller, he marr. to Margaret Rössler age 19 (b. 1833), da. of Paul Rössler and Maria Josepha Reiss. Both were "single" i.e. previously unmarried? He was stated to be a resident of München and she of Rastadt. Marriage witnesses were Franz Wagner (J. Adam's uncle) and Michael Georg Schmidt.²

Children of Adam Wagner and Margaret Rössler:

a. Franz Wagner, born Oct. 5, 1853, München, godparents Franz Nuss and Magdalena Wagner. Magdalena probably was the daughter of Franz Wagner and Salomea Walter, born Jan. 8, 1836.
b. Johann Wagner, born March 24, 1856, München, godparents Franz Wagner and Agnes Heil, Their son Johann jr. died Sept. 17, 1872 in München, age 16 (= b. 1856), parents stated to be Johann & Margaret Wagner.

c. Anton Wagner, born March 19, 1858 München, godparents Anton Rössler and Margaret Kessel, Anton died ca. 1885 Russia, marr. ca. 1879 **Salomea Heck** b. Dec. 1860 München, she died Sept. 1928 Fairview, Alberta. She remarried in 1885 to Franz Joseph Dettling (1853-1935) ca. 1904 in Texas. Children:

1). Siegfried (Fred) Wagner, b. June 1880 München, d. Sept. 13, 1939 Fairview, Alberta; marr. Annie. Children: Lena, Joseph, William. Emigrated from Montana to Canada 1912.

2). Barbara Wagner, b. April 21, 1882 München, d. May 13, 1974 Witelaw, Alberta; marr. Jan. 15, 1902 in Texas to John Balthasar Rombs (1880-1933.

3) Joseph Wagner, b. April 1884 München.

d. Margaret Wagner, born April 11, 1860, München, godparents Lorenz Rössler and Margaret Wagner.

e. Katharina Wagner, born Aug. 1, 1862, München, godparents Bernard Rössler and Katharina Vogt.

f. Rochus Wagner³, born Aug. 16, 1864, München, godparents Johann Schropp and Maria Anna Vogt. Rochus marr. Katherine Kowitz (also Kowis), she was born in München Aug. 20, 1868, da. of Georg Kowitz and Margaret Nuss, and probably the sister of Franz Kowitz. Rochus and his family emigrated in May 1913 with Jakobina Martz on the ship "The Bosnia," she was his future daughter-in-law. They settled in the Sedley and Prelate, Saskatchewan area in 1913. Rochus died Oct. 29, 1919 Swift Current near Prelate, Sask., age 55. Katherine remarried to Anton Bengert, a widower age 55, in Prelate. She died Feb. 14, 1943 Prelate, Sask. Rochus and Katharina had six children (below). Children of Rochus Wagner and Katherine Kowitz:

> 1) Margaret Rose Wagner, b. Aug. 22, 1887 München, she d. Aug. 29, 1967 Swift Current, Sask., marr. Zacharius Wagner from Krasna, Bessarabia on Jan. 20, 1914 in Regina, Sask., son of Josef Wagner and Marianna Harsche, he was b. Mar. 25, 1888, d. Dec. 6, 1961 Weyburn, Sask. They had the same surname but weren't related. 12 children of Margaret Rose and Zacharius Wagner:

a) Mary Wagner, b. Oct. 10, 1914 Fox Valley, Sask, d. Sept. 29, 1941 Moose Jaw, Sask.

b) Rochus Leo Wagner, b. Oct. 28, 1915 Fox Valley, Sask., d. Mar. 23, 2009, Regina, Sask., marr. Eleanor Ann Gross on Feb. 6, 1947 Swift Current, Sask., she b. June 15, 1924 Hodgeville, Sask.

c) Joseph Wagner, b. Mar. 3, 1917, Fox Valley, Sask., d. Nov. 13, 1993 Swift Current, Sask.

d) Kasper George Wagner, b. June 25, 1918 Prelate, Sask., d. Nov. 1, 1999, Saskatoon, Sask., marr. first Elisabeth Hubert, b. Oct. 17, 1950 Lancer Sask, she d. Jan. 21, 1973 Swift Current Sask., marr. second to Marie Wingenbach Dec. 19, 1973.

e) Euphemia Barbara Wagner, b. Nov. 28, 1919 Prelate, Sask., d. Nov. 1, 1999 Moose Jaw, Sask.,

marr. Josef Nicholas Steinkey Nov. 1, 1939 Swift Current, Sask.

f) Peter Samuel Wagner, b. Mar. 25, 1920 Prelate, Sask., d. March 22, 1987 Calgary, Alberta, marr. Emma Pierson 1950 Prelate, Sask.

g) Katherine Odelia Wagner, b. Aug. 27, 1922 Prelate, Sask., d. Dec. 26, 1994, Kelowna, B.C., marr. Joseph Uzelman in 1943, he b. Sept. 6, 1909 Revenue, Sask., d. Dec. 7, 1998 Kelowna, B.C.

h) Anthony James Wagner, b. Jan. 20, 1924 Prelate, Sask., marr. Ione Hellen English, Oct. 24, 1947 Vancouver, B.C., he d. Oct. 14, 200f Maple Ridge, B.C.

i) Allan Leonard Wagner, b. June 20, 1925 Prelate, Sask., d. Dec. 11, 2003, Regina Sask., marr. Minnie Mary Priscilla Linnen on Aug. 18, 1951 Regina, Sask., she b. Feb. 6, 1925 Francis, Sask.

j) Emily Irene Wagner, b. Jan. 31, 1927, Lancer, Sask., d. Dec. 23, 2014 Betts, Alberta, marr. Harold Charles Betts on Al;ril 13, 1950 Calgary, Alberta.

k) George William Wagner, b. Jan. 30, 1930 Lancer, Sask., marr. Marjorie Ellen Bell on Nov. 1, 1950 Calgary, Alberta.

I) Rosemarie Wagner, b. Dec. 15, 1930 Lancer, Sask., d. Jan. 27, 1997 Swift Current, Sask., marr. Gregory Weinberger n June 8, 1953 in Medicine Hat, Alberta, he b. Dec. 26, 1924 in Rastadt, Sask., d. Nov. 21, 2006 Swift Current, Sask.

2) Kasper Wagner, b. Dec. 12, 1890, München, son of Rochus, d. April 22, 1974 Medicine Hat, Alberta. Kasper immigrated to Canada prior to Rochus. He marr. Jakobina Martz (also known as Anna), dau. of Johann Martz and Maria Ackermann on Nov. 11, 1913 in St. Mary's Church in Regina, Sasketchewan, she was b. Sept. 18, 1894 in Russia, she d. May 10, 1918 Prelate, Sask. Kasper's 2nd marr. to Frances Zieglar 1919, she d. Oct. 10, 1939. His 3rd marr. to Rita Ehli 1940, she d. June 1, 1985. He wrote a letter referring to Franz Kowitz and cousins Bernhard and Georg Kowitz.

3) Maximilian Rochus Wagner, b. March 19, 1895 München, son of Rochus, d. April 17, 1956 Prelate, Sask. He marr. Antonina Hopfauf Feb. 7, 1921 in Krassna, Sask., she was b. April 12, 1903, dau. of Ferdinand Hopfauf and Mary Bernhardt, she was b. April 12, 1903 in Karlsruhe, d. Nov. 2, 1986 Leader, Sask.

4) Anton Wagner, b. April 10, 1899 München, son of Rochus, d. May 9, 1959 Saskatchewan, marr. **Clara Rissling** b. April 9, 1905 Seltz, Kutschurgan district, Russia, she d. July 20, 1960.

- a) Siegfried Wagner
- b) Joseph Wagner

5) Ottilia Wagner, b. May 10, 1901 München, dau. of Rochus, d. Nov. 19, 1918 Prelate, Sask from the flue epidemic, single.

6) Euphemia Wagner, b. Dec. 27, 1905 München, dau. of Rochus, d. May 2, 1998, Leader, Sask., d. May 2, 1998 Leader, Sask., marr. Remigius Rissling Sr. on Oct. 27, 1924 in Blumenfeld, Sask, son of Frank Rissling and Emilia Maffenbeier. He was b. May 10, 1903 Frankfeldt, Russia, and d. Nov. 12, 1944 Prelate, Sask.

(Children of J. Adam Wagner and Margaret Rössler, cont.:) **g. Peter Wagner**, born Mar. 2, 1867, München, the son of Adam Wagner and **Margaret Rössler**, godparents Peter Wagner and Salomea Schäfer. He is probably the same peson as Peter Wagner b. March 14, 1867, son of Adam Wagner and Margaret "Kessel", her surname was probably mistranslated, and their birthdates differ by 12 days. Peter died of diptheria on Aug. 20, 1879 in Munchen, age 12 (= b. ca. 1867).

h. Salomea Wagner, b. Nov. 18, 1871 München, she died March 27, 1954 in Sedley, Saskatchewan. She married Michael Wormsbecher, b. Sept. 20, 1869 in Rastadt, he d. in Sedley, 1946. They emigrated to Saskatchewan in 1899, had 8 children.

i. Michael Wagner, b. 1871 Rastadt (poss. not the same as Adam Wagner in München ?_.

j. Ottilia Wagner, b. München, immigrated to Halifax, Nova Scotia May 23, 1913.

k. Nikolaus Wagner, b. ca. 1873, d. in München Aug. 30, 1878, age 5, parents stated to be Adam Wagner, son of Ferdinand, and Margaret, da. of Paul Rössler.

6. Franz Wagner, born April 11, 1833, son of Ferdinand and Elisabeth Miller/Müller, she stated to be "daughter of Johann Miller."⁴ Franz was the father to my grandfather, Adam Wagner. He married <u>Anna Maria</u> <u>Stübich</u> on Nov. 6, 1856 in München, he was 23 years old, and she was 18, Franz's mother was stated to be "Elisabeth, daughter of Johann Mille-". Anna Maria Stübich was born Nov. 25, 1841 in München, her father was <u>Simon Stübich</u> (born Dec. 29 1815). Simon was the son of <u>Andreas</u> <u>Stübich</u> (b. ca. 1787) and <u>Katharina Volltrauer</u> (b. ca. 1791). Katharina Volltrauer was probably the daughter of Jacob Volltrauer and <u>Maria Bast</u>, born in Hördt. Anna Maria Stübich's mother was <u>Anna Maria Giesser</u> (probably born ca. 1815). Anna Maria Stübich-Wagner died about 1873 and Franz Wagner died about 1882.⁵ The known children of Franz Wagner and Anna Maria Stübich were:

a. Anna Wagner, bap. Sept. 30, 1857 München, god fa. was Peter Wagner, Franz's brother.

b. Maria Katherine Wagner, born Feb. 15, 1859, München; godparents Leonhard Thome and Maria Katherine Wagner. Note: a different baptismal record shows Feb. 15, 1860, possibly an error in translation.

c. Franz Wagner bapt. Sept. 4, 1862 München.

d. <u>Adam Wagner</u>, born Feb. 17, 1, 1867, Kuschnerowo; my

grandfather, he married <u>Katharine Reis</u> from Rastadt.

e. Joseph Wagner, born July 3, 1869, bapt. July 25, 1869, Kuschnerowo.

f. Johann Wagner, born ca. 1870, München or Kuschnerowo, he is not shown in the baptismal records for München, died Feb. 6, 1943 in Fox Valley, Saskatchewan. My grandfather's bachelor younger brother.

g. Franziska Wagner, born ca. 1872, died of diptheria in München on March 16, 1879, age 7 years.

7. Peter Wagner, born May 26, 1838, München, son of **Ferdinand** and **Elisabeth Miller**, daughter of **Johann Miller** (probably in Speier). On Nov. 23, 1864 Peter marr. **Anna Maria Kessel**, b. 1845, da. of **Anton Kessel** and **Maria Petrizka** (Patricia?). He was age 25 and she was 19.

⁴ Tiraspol Catholic Consistory birth record for Franz Wagner states his parents' names as Ferdinand and Elisabeth. His adjusted Julian calendar birthdate is April 23, 1833. The godparents were Johann Franz Kessel and Anna Thome. Franz's marriage record in 1856 states his mother was Elisabeth Miller. She may have been the daughter of Johann Miller in the colony of Speier.

⁵ Information on their approximate death dates is derived from stories told by my grandfather, Adam Wagner, which were passed down in my family. Adam's brief life story in the St. Joseph's church anniversary book mentions how old he was when his father died.

The marriage witnesses were Franz Wagner (jr.) and Bernhard Flick. Peter and Anna Maria had one known child:

a. Johann Wagner, born June 7, 1867, München, stated to be the son of Peter Wagner and Anna Maria Kessel, godparents Johann Scherger and Katharina Vogt.

b) Emma Wagner, born Mar. 3, 1928, Rastadt.

c) Rudolf Wagner, born 1919, Rastadt, deported to Siberia 1940.

The photo was taken from the family tree of Theo Wagner in Germany, he labeled it as his "Opa" (grandpa) Josef. The closest candidate is Josef Wagner shown in the EWZ Form 50-1079 above, Josef born in 1892 was evacuated to Germany by the Wehrmacht during W.W.2. The statement that Josef's grandfather was Ferdinand may be based on faulty memory during wartime. Ferdinand was born in 1793 and he would not likely have had a son Franz born as late as 1857 as shown in the EWZ form. Ferdinand's

son, Johann Georg, had a son Franz b. April 3, 1856. This date is reasonably close to the birth year 1857 for Franz shown in the EWZ record, which indicates that Ferdinand was the great-grandfather of Josef, not the grandfather.

Franz Wagner's youngest son Franz jr. and his descendants

Franz Wagner jr., b. May 19, 1798 Insheim in the Pfalz, was married to **Katherine Salomea Walter** (shown in records as Salomea), she was b. 1803 in Schönau, district of Pirmasens, Pfalz, the da. of **Christian Walter**. The 1816 R.L. for Landau shows Christian Walter 53, wife Magdalena 43, children Johann 20, Salomea 13 (= b. ca. 1803)⁷, Margareta 11, and Katharina 10.

The 1828 report for München shows that Franz jr. had two sons and four daughters. His known children include:

Maria Wollbaum. She married **Georg Kowitz** on Oct. 15, 1840, she was age 19, he was son of Adam Kowitz and Philippina Bengert, (Phillipina b. 1802 in Bergzabern, Rhine, Palatinate (Pfalz), d. 21 Aug. 1880 in Munchen Julian calendar). Their children:

f. Maximilian Wagner, born Aug. 23, 1856 München, godparents Maximilian Giesser and Katharina Wagner.

5. **Anna Maria Wagner**, born Oct. 15, 1831 München, is shown in the baptismal records as the daughter of Franz Wagner and Salomea Walter. On Nov. 22, 1849 she married **Johann Kniel**, son of Peter Kniel and Elisabeth Leipold, she was age 19 (= b. ca. 1830). On Jan. 15, 1861 she remarr. **Jakob Thomä (Thomas)**, she was age 29, stated to be a widow, da. of Franz Wagner and Salomea Walter. Children:

b. Albert Thomä, born April 20, 1863, München, godparents Andreas Schäfer and Anna Wollbaum.

6. Peter Franz Wagner, born Oct. 2, 1833, München. (See below).

7. Magdalena Wagner, born Jan. 8, 1836, München. She married Leonard Thomä, they had two children, Mariana b. Aug. 6, 1863 and Ignatz Thomä born Aug. 1, 1864 in Kuschnerowo.

Peter Franz Wagner, born Oct. 2, 1833, the son of Franz jr. and Salomea Walter, was apparently the same person as **Franz Wagner** who marr. **Katharina Eva Ehrmantraut** on Oct. 25, 1855, the da. of Johann Ehrmantraut and Margareta Giesser, Franz was shown as age 23 and she as 18, he was a resident of München and she of Rastadt.⁸ In later records Peter Franz used only the name Franz. The 1920 death records in Rastadt state that Franz was a farmer, married, born Oct. 1, <u>1829</u> in München, his father was Franz Wagner, and he d. May 31, 1920 in München of "old age." Presumably this Franz was the same person as Peter Franz, they had the same birthdate (Oct. 1-2), although different years, and the same wife Katharina Ehrmantraut. Peter had an older brother, Franz Wagner b. Feb. 28, 1827, who could also be the one who died in 1820, he would have been 5 years older and his birthdate doesn't match the death record.

Anna Katherina Wagner served as godmother for Katherina Ackermann, March 9, 1855, München. She was probably Katharina Ehrmantraut-Wagner, wife of Peter Franz Wagner.

The children of Peter Franz Wagner and Katharina Eva Ehrmantraut were:

a. Johann Wagner, born Feb. 24, 1858 München, godparents Johann Schropp and Maria Anna Kniel.

Apparently this refers to her infant son.

d. Peter Wagner b. March 26, 1862 München.

e. Anne Maria Wagner b. ca. 1863 in München, d. Aug 1926 in Rastadt, "age 63" (=b. ca. 1863) Her 1st marriage was to **Gabriel Vogt** (d. 1900), they had 5 known children. Her second marriage was to **Ignatz Daratha**, 3 known children. Anna Maria's children from Vogt and Daratha:

Jan 26, 1926 in Rastadt and Celestina was deported by Soviets to central Asia, she d. Oct. 19, 1968 in Tschkalowski, Tajikistan. Due to the same surnames with their husbands, Julianne and Celestina likely changed the spelling of their maiden names to "Vocht."⁹

Julianne's and Celestina's maiden name was originally "Vogt," and presumably the spelling was changed to "Vocht" and "Focht" after their marriages with Gabriel Vogt and Stephen Vogt. They apparently were not related to their husbands. Celestina and Julianne were daughters of Gabriel Vogt (b. 1863, son of Adam Vogt, b. 1818). Celestina's husband Stephen was the son of Paul Vogt (b. 1858, grandson of Martin Vogt, gr.grandson of Johann Vogt b. 1781). "Vogt" is a relatively common German surname, pronounced as "Focht." Some descendants also spell the surname as "Focht," or as "Focht-Vogt."

This indicates that he was likely the son of Franz Wagner and Kath. Vogt, name Markus may be for a son.

The baptismal records show that Franz Wagner jr. and Salomea served frequently as godparents for several children born in the 1830s through the 1860s. Other than the earliest records which specify "Franz and Salomea Wagner," it's unclear which of the later records referred to Franz son of Ferdinand or Peter Franz son of Franz jr. Both were born in the same year, 1833 and it is likely that both served in the role of godfather at various times. Peter Franz Wagner apparently went by the name Franz in later years, perhaps to distinguish himself from Peter Wagner.

Her birth year 1819 is too early for her to be the same person as Magdalena da. of Franz and Salomea b. 1836.

Christina Wagner (probably born in the 1820s) served as godmother in 1835 and later. She was likely unmarried in 1835 because she was listed with her maiden name Wagner. Later she was married to **Franz Michael Herauf**.

This couple may have been Johann and Magdalena "Tolid" mentioned above in Rohrbach, if they perhaps resided outside the colony their names wouldn't occur in other records.

Anna Wagner (also referred to as "**Wachmann**" in the EWZ forms, probably based on how the surname is pronounced in dialect), born between 1851-61, marr. **Martin Martz**, 3 known children born from 1881 to 1896 in München.

Margaret Wagner, born ca. 1868 in München, d. 1933 in Niederdorf, marr. **Pius Merdian**, 5 known children. Margareta was probably the daughter of either Georg Wagner or Adam Wagner (above), both of whom had daughters with that name born in 1867 and 1869.

Johann Wagner, born ca. 1883 in München, marr. **Helena Bender**, one known child, Helene Bender's second marriage was to Jakob Eberle.

Johann Wagner, marr. **Katharina**, one child **Genoveva**. They are shown in the 1920 landowner list for München.

Joseph Wagner shown on the 1920 landowner list of Rastadt. He was age 23, b. ca. 1897, son of Franz Wagner, and he was marr. to **Rosa Müller** 27, with one son, **Rudolf Wagner** age 1. My grandfather, Adam Wagner, had a brother Joseph who was born in 1869, but the dates don't match.

There are two death records for children in the Wagner family in 1830:

Maria Katharina Wagner from Rastadt, a young girl age 6 years, died in the Lord on Sept. 20, [1830] and was buried in the cemetery at München.

Franz Wagner from München, a young boy age 3 years, died on Sept. 26, [1830] and was buried in the cemetery at München.

Since they were young children who died in the same year we may assume that they died of disease.

Unfortunately no information is provided in these two death records about their parents. By 1830 Ferdinand was married to Elisabeth Kroll from neighboring Rastadt. This may explain why the death record for Maria Katharina Wagner states that she was "from Rastadt," but buried in the cemetery at München.

Peter Wagner marr. Maria Eva Boehm. They had a dau. Rosa Maria Wagner, bapt. 31 Jan. 1891 in München.

Margaret Metz nee Wagner was godmother for Rafael Feibiger Jan. 1891 in München.

Wagner family in the USA (my grandparents, Adam Wagner and Katherine Reis and their descendants:)

Adam Wagner, born Feb. 17, 1867, Kuschnerowo (a temporary farming residence for several colonist families from München, Ukraine); died April 3, 1922 of throat cancer, Dickinson, N.D.. Katherina Wagner died Feb. 27, 1930, Dickinson, N.D. of spinal meningitis. Adam and Katherine Wagner had 10 children:





Wagner family in Canada

A. Johann Wagner. As we have seen in our detailed discussion in the previous chapter, the emigrants from the German colonies in the Beresan region settled primarily in the Dakotas and Saskatchewan. My grandfather, Adam, had a brother Johann, born 1870 in München who eventually settled near Fox Valley, Saskatchewan. He undoubtedly was drawn to that area because other families from the Beresan colonies, such as the Obrigewitsch, also settled there. John never married and he died in Fox Valley, Saskatchewan on Feb. 6, 1943.

B. Rochus Wagner,¹³ born Aug. 16, 1864, the son of Adam Wagner and Margaret Rössler in München, was a cousin to my grandfather Adam Wagner. Rochus married Katherine Kowitz (Kowis), who was born in München on Aug. 20, 1868, she was the daughter of Georg Kowitz and Margaret Nuss. Katherine was 18 years and Rochus 22 years at the time of their marriage in 1886. Little is known of their life together in Russia but they did have a large family, many of whom did not survive. Rochus Wagner and family immigrated in May 1913 on the ship "The Bosnia," along with Jakobina (also Anna) Martz, his future

daughter-in-law and with 11 other families, and 2 single males from Munchen, Russia (plus 1 single male from Rastadt). They sailed from Hamburg, Germany and arrived in Halifax, Nova Scotia on 23 May 1913. All listed their destination as Sedley, Sask They settled in Sedley area in 1913. They later moved to the Prelate area, where Rochus died Oct. 29, 1919, age 55, at Swift Current, Sask. Katherine remarried on March 29, 1925 with Anton Joseph Bengert, a widower age 55, the son of Joseph Bengert and Katharina Roll. It is thought that one of Rochus' brothers went to Argentina and one to Texas. Rochus' father Adam is said to have married twice and Rochus was from the second family. One of his half-brothers lived at Vibank, Saskatchewan. There were also two sisters who came to Saskatchewan. In Russia, Rochus worked as a herdsman of horses. Each farmer whose animals he cared for paid him a fee and the horses were raised in a community pasture.

6. Kasper, born Dec. 12, 1890 München, died Apr. 22, 1974. He immigrated to Canada before Rochus. Kasper marr. Nov. 11, 1913 to Jakobina Martz in St. Mary's Church in Regina, Sask. She immigrated in May 1913 with Rochus and his family. She was recorded as "Anna Maria Wagner," age 22 (she was actually 18). Jakobina (Anna) was b. Sept. 18, 1894, the da. of Johann Martz and Maria Ackermann in München. Jakobina was buried in the Blumenfeld Cemetery, her name was recorded as "Jacklene."

C. Katharina (Katy) Wagner, born June 15, 1863 and her husband, Johannes (Joseph) Schropp, from München, were on the same ship with Adam Wagner in 1891. They initially settled near Regina, Saskatchewan in 1891, then moved to Montana in 1899.¹⁴ USA naturalization record for Joseph Schropp lists he as born 29 May 1862, baptism records list 4 Jun 1861 in München. Adam Wagner & Margaretha Rössler had a daughter named Katharina born 1 Aug 1862 in München, who was apparently Katharina Wagner wife of Joseph Schropp, although their birthdates don't match. Katy was apparently the sister to Salomea Wagner-Wormsbecher and Rochus Wagner. Joseph and Katy had three known children:

1) Margaret Schropp b. Sept. 15, 1882 in Russia, her husband was surnamed Loomis, she d. Mar. 14, 1870 in San Bruno, CA.

2) Martin Schropp b. Aug. 30, 1884 in Russia, marr. in 1906 in Billings, MT, he d. Oct. 30, 1973 in Chicago.

3) Annalie (Amelia) b. ca. 1890.

Katy and Joseph Schropp resided in Billings, MT at the time of her death on July 12, 1920 (age 58, = b. 1862) while she was visiting relatives in Regina, Saskatchewan, probably her sibligs Rochus Wagner and Salomea Wagner-Wormsbecher.

D. Salomea Wagner was apparently the sister to Katy Wagner-Schropp and Rochus Wagner. Baptismal records in Russia show her as born Nov. 18, 1871 in München, the daughter of Adam Wagner and Margaret Rössler. Her findagrave.com record shows her birth date of 16 Oct 1872. Her husband Michael Wormsbecker was born 29 Sept. 1869 according to findagrave.com. Baptism records list him as born 23 Sept 1869 in Kuschnerowo, which was apparently leased land by families from München. Salomea and Michael emigrated from Rastadt in 1899, with three children (Margaret, Katherine, Dorothea). Margaret was b. Feb. 4, 1895 in Russia, she married Leonard Materi, and she died on 5 October 1975, in Port Alberni, British Columbia. Michael and Salomea had a total of 8 children. They settled in Rastad in Saskatchewan (also

known as "Seven Colony"). Both Michael & Saloma Wormsbecher are buried in the cemetery in Sedley, Sask.

E. Mathias Wagner, born 1887 in München and **Johannes Wagner**, born ca. 1876, apparently took a train to Libau, Latvia, where they departed on the steamship S.S. Kursk on May 21, 1912, bound for Sedley, Saskatchewan and they arrived on June 3, 1912. They were joining a friend Johannes Resch in Sedley. Their point of origin was stated as München, Russia. Their mother, who remained behind in München, was stated to be Martha Wagner. Johannes was 36 at the time (= b. 1876), stated to be single. Mathias was 24 (= b. ca. 1888), and Mathias' wife was Katherine Reichert, 19 (= b. 1893). Mathias died 1951 in Sedley, Sask. Katharina Reichert d. 1972), daughter of Meinrad Reichert & Sophia Lanz.

Wagner family in Argentina

Large numbers of Germans from Russia also settled in South America, especially in Argentina. There are church records showing that families from the Beresan colonies, including Rastadt, settled in the region in Punta Alta, which is on the east coast of Argentina. Harvey Eberle sent me several records that he extracted from Argentinian and Brazilian churchbooks.

Michael Haag also sent me the following:

Magdalena Haag was born on June 8, 1905 and baptized on the following day. Her father was Franz Haag, born in Rastadt, Russia and her mother was Isabel Freiss (probably Friess), also born in Russia.

Magdalena Haag was married 18 years later, on Nov. 13, 1924, to **Francisco** (**Franz**) **Wagner** in the parish church in Punta Alta. One of the witnesses was Andreas Haag.

The Haag family has long roots in Rastadt going back to its beginning in 1809. Franz Wagner in this marriage record was probably born in Argentina around 1905, as was Magdalena, soon after their families emigrated there.

Additional following records are from Harvey Eberle:
